



The Parochial Church Council has recommended that in order to continue supporting Christ Church, one of the monthly services in St Edward's would be non-Communion. This would release Clergy to take a monthly service at Christ Church. For those who would like to continue to receive Communion every week, this will be possible by attending Christ Church on the non-Communion day of St Edward's. This would normally be on the 4th Sunday in the month but in May it will be on the 2nd Sunday (ie 12th May). Future dates for 2010 are 23rd June, 28th July, 25th August, 22nd September, 27th October, 24th November and 22nd December.
